 - Tom M. Frost Award** - Given annually by the Aquatic Section for outstanding graduate research in aquatic ecology as demonstrated in a recently published paper.
 - George Mercer Award** - Given annually for an outstanding ecological research paper written by a younger ecologist.
 - Eugene P. Odum Award of Southeast Chapter** - Given to a student for an outstanding paper presented on an ecological topic at the annual meeting of the Association of Southern Biologists.
 - Forrest Shreve Student Research Fund** - Given to a student for basic or applied ecological research on deserts of the southwestern United States and/or northwestern Mexico.
 - Robert H. Whittaker Travel Fellowship** - Given to outstanding foreign ecologists to help defray costs of travel to the United States for visiting colleagues and/or attending an ESA Annual Meeting.
 - Jay Anderson Award** - Supports programs and activities related to ecosystems of the West and Pacific Northwest.
