Murray F. Buell ascribed great importance to the participation of students at meetings and to excellence in the presentation of papers. To honor his dedication to the Ecological Society of America and to the younger generation of ecologists, this award is presented to a student for the outstanding oral paper presented at ESA's Annual Meeting.

The winner of the Murray F. Buell award in 2000 is Jennifer Klug, for her paper "Interactions between bacteria and phytoplankton affect algal response to nutrients and dissolved organic matter," based on her current doctoral research at the University of Wisconsin-Madison under the supervision of Dr. Tony Ives. Jennifer's presentation was described by Buell judges as "an excellent paper that used a powerful combination of experiments and mathematical models to test an interesting suite of hypotheses concerning interactions between algae and bacteria." Jennifer received her bachelor's degree from Indiana University and her Master's degree in Zoology at University of Wisconsin-Madison (also with Dr. Tony Ives).
